

Comparative Study Of Green Practices In Haryana State Universities

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Abstract:

Universities in the state are regarded as ‘small cities’ due to their large size, population, and the various complex activities taking place in campuses, which have some serious direct and indirect impacts on the environment. The current study focuses on the green practices in state universities of Haryana. The comparative analysis has been done between the multiple case studies and find out the best green practices being adopted in universities for moving towards making the green campus and recommend the area of improvement for making environment sustainable campus.

KEY WORDS: Universities, Environment, Sustainable Development, Green Practices

Objectives

The objective of the study is to done the comparative analysis of green practices implemented in daily operation in Haryana state universities for making the sustainable campus and find out the common practices and area of improvement for developing sustainable development.

Methodology

Qualitative research design is used in current study by employing case study approach of qualitative inquiry to study green practices in depth in Haryana state universities. Three oldest state universities are selected as sample unit. This study focusses on operational parameters out of the parameters in respect of four area including administration, curriculum and research area, explored by *Maryam Faghihimani (2010)*. Primary Data of this study have been collected from 3 state universities through observation, photographs, and in-depth interviews of experts, relevant authorities, professors, research scholars of the and various stakeholders. Analysis of secondary literature including policy statements, university documents etc has also been done. The parameters of the study are as follow:

Study area

State university of Haryana are the main study area of the current study. There are 19 state universities in Haryana. Three oldest state universities are selected as sample unit which are as follow.

Kurukshetra University:

The KU is the oldest state university of Haryana as it is established in 1956 as unitary residential university. The foundation stone of the university was laid by the first President (Dr. Rajendra Prasad) of India. It is located in Kurukshetra city of Haryana which is the holy city because of the historical battle of “Mahabharata” and delivery place of great message of Bhagwat Gita. The campus of the university is situated on western bank of Bhahm Sarover and extended over an area of 400 acres (university website).

Maharishi Dayanand University:

The MDU University is the second oldest university of Haryana which is situated in Rohtak city. Initially, the university is established as Rohtak university in 1976 through act no 25 of the Haryana Legislative Assembly. The main motive of the university is to promote interdisciplinary higher education and research in area of environment, ecological and life science. The university is rechristened as Maharishi Dayanand University in 1977 after the name of great visionary and social reformer. The university get recognition of UGC as a higher education regulatory body of India in 1979. (university website).

Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology:

The GJU was establish on 2nd October 1995 under Haryana State Legislative Act no 17 of 1995 for providing education on Pharmacy, Environment Studies, Technology, Renewable Energy Sources, Mass Media and Management Studies. The university is named after Saint Guru Jambheshwer ji Maharaj who was the great environmentalist of 15th century. The campus of the university is situated in Hisar city of Haryana and got it recognition of UGC under sec. 2(f) in 1996 and sec. 12(B) in 1997 of UGC Act and it has been accredited by National Assessment & Accreditation Council as ‘A’ grade university in 2002,2009 and recently in 2019 (university website).

Introduction

In the modern era, everyone is moving towards convenience. These conveniences are achieved at the cost of environment; as a result, environment is being degraded due to the heavy demand of conveniences in life. Nowadays most of the organizations are moving towards Environment Sustainability. They are framing policies and strategies according to environmental concern. The present study focuses on environment sustainability practices in the universities of Haryana. The educational organizations like universities also cause serious environmental pollution in the form of energy and material consumption via activities and operations in teaching and research, provision of support services etc, which could be considerably reduced by an effective choice of organizational and technical measures. Now the educational sector is also taking initiatives toward environmental concern. **Alshuwaikhat and Abubakar (2008)** in their research revealed that many environmental protection measures can be seen at some universities, but a more systematic and sustainable approach to reduce the negative impact of those activities to make the campuses more sustainable, is generally lacking. **Faghihimani (2010)** says that, a global trend among universities shows that they are revising their mission and restructuring their courses, research programmes and operations on campus to include sustainability in their perspectives and practices.

Sustainable Development

The word “sustainable development” was first introduced after the Rio Earth Summit in 1992 which was organised for global environmental discussions and upgrading the primary framework presented at United National Conference on the Human Environment at Stockholm in 1972(Johnson,2007). The Rio Declaration on Environment and Development highlights the significance of education in reducing the environmental degradation (Cleveland & Kubiszewski, 2007). Sustainable Development can be defined as an approach to achieve human development goals without degrading the environment to provide natural resources and ecosystem services upon which the economy and society depend. In other words, sustainable development means creating such a community where human needs can be satisfied with the use of living conditions and resources without degrading the ecological system (Wikipedia, 2018). Broadly, the concept of sustainable development combines environmental goals, especially ensuring resource availability (avoiding negative environmental impacts) and maintaining biodiversity with economic goals (especially economic viability), and the social goals (especially social justice), all of which have to be pursued simultaneously.

As per current condition of natural resources and environment, environment sustainable and green management is the requirement of today. As per the data collected for the study, all the universities of Haryana have taken number of initiatives to making the environment sustainable campus and promoting sustainable development. Some green initiatives which are common in all the universities are as follows:

Best Practices:

➤ **Establish Dedicated Department:**

All the state universities have setup a dedicated institute of environment science which provides the professional courses in environment protection and preservation. The Kurukshetra University (KU) has "Institute of environment studies", Maharishi Dayanand University (MDU) has "Department of environment science" and Guru Jambheshwar University of Science and Technology (GJU) has "Department of Environment Sc & Engineering". These institutions also support the interdisciplinary environmental sustainability education and conduct research in respect of environment sustainability.

➤ **Install Solar Power plant:**

All the state universities are in process of making and utilising solar energy. Recently the Kurukshetra University has got approved two major projects from the state government - one is 500KW solar energy plant and another is 100KW which is under progress for installation over the roof of buildings. The MDU has installed Solar panels on the roof of the major buildings of university. Almost one third campus has been converted into solar system. University has requirement of nearly 4 MW electricity and 1 MV solar plant system has been fixed or fabricated in terms of BOT (Built, Operate and Transfer) basis and the GJU has installed solar plant up to the capacity of 1 MW on university buildings which satisfies the requirement of 45% of total consumption of university electricity.

➤ **Install Sewage treatment Plant:**

All the state universities have installed sewage treatment plant (STP) where the university waste is treated and after treatment the effluent is being utilised and reused for gardening and for horticulture purpose. KU has installed STP plant, costing Rs. 4.66 crores, built in area of 2 acres which has capacity of 100 % treatment of 2.44 million litres of water per day. GJU has the plant of capacity of 2.5 MLD and in MDU, it is under construction.

➤ **Install rain harvesting system:**

All the state universities have realised the gravity of water falling level of ground water. So, the arrangement has been made to resort to the rain water harvesting to recharge the ground level water. So, all the universities have developed Rain water harvesting system in campus.

➤ **Promote greenery:**

All the universities are focusing on making the campus green. More than 20000 plants have been planted in campus of KU and felling of trees is being banned in campus. In MDU, approximately 44,000 Eucalyptus trees had been planted on 10 acres of university land by forest department of Haryana Govt. which have been grown fully and more than 1200 varieties of herbs have been planted in herbal garden of campus. In addition of all these, approximately 18500 decorative/ornamental plants, bushes, shrubs etc have been planted around the office buildings, residences, Rose Garden, library, Faculty House, Hostels etc for providing aroma as well as ensuring longer working hour with lesser stress. And in GJU, approximately 35% area of the campus is reserved for the greenery purpose. In 2009, University has targeted the plantation of one lakh trees and around 35000 trees have been planted till now and 125 big trees have been transplanted in campus (NAAC Report, 2014).

➤ **Support E-document:**

All the state universities are the supporter of E-documents and encourage that in their campus. The hard copy has been replaced with e-document to the great extent due to which all the information is circulated through email among the faculty members.

➤ **Support vegetarian diet:**

Most of the Haryana state universities serve vegetarian diet in hostels as well as campus cafeteria. As KU is situated in Kurukshetra city which is a holy city since the time of Mahabharata, non-veg is completely banned in city as well as in campus. MDU is named after Maharishi Dayanand who is great visionary and social reformer and GJU is named after Guru Jambheshwer ji who is Maharaj saint environmentalist of 15th century. So, non-veg food is not served their hostels. Only veg food is provided to the students in university hostels as well as cafeteria.

Area of Improvement:

In spite of various initiation taken the university still there is some area where improvement is required for making the sustainable campus and conserving the natural resources and environment. These areas are as follow:

➤ **Plastic in campus need to be banned:**

Use of plastic is still in use in Haryana state universities in form of Cold drink bottle, water bottle, rappers, disposable glasses, etc. which are very harmful of the environment. However, single use plastic should be completely banned in universities campus. Till now, no state universities have taken such initiative. So, all the state university should not only ban the single use plastic but should also create awareness to avoid use of plastic among students, staff members and society.

➤ **Paper cup and paper plates need to be banned:**

Use of paper cups and plates also harm the environment as these are made from tree which is the cause of deforestation. Deforestation provide the negative impact of environment and natural resources. The state universities of Haryana avoid their use in campus but does not banned it completely. So, all the universities should completely ban the use of paper cups and plates with in the campus.

➤ **Strict rule of both side printing on paper need to be made:**

As Paper is made from tree. So, it requires cutting of tree which is the cause of deforestation. Deforestation provide the negative impact of environment and natural resources. A huge amount of paper is consumed in universities in form of assignments, thesis, exam answer sheets, reports, etc. As all the university are supporting e-document and making efforts to minimise the consumption of paper but more efforts can be taken in respect of printing. So, all the university should support printing on both the side of paper and make rule regarding it. MDU have made the rule of printing both side for thesis, assignment and reports. All another state university should also make efforts in this direction and make rule regarding it for cutting paper consumption.

➤ **Use of chemical hazards need to be banned in campus:**

Use of chemical hazards and chemical fertiliser also provide a very negative impact on environment but these are still in use in universities. So, all the state universities should completely ban their use in campus and replace the chemical fertiliser with towards organic fertiliser

➤ **Signboard for conserving resources need to be placed:**

All the Haryana state university should place Instruction card in every department to switch off the electric equipments or appliances when that are not in use.

➤ **Sensor fitting should be installed in bathrooms:**

As India is suffering from water scarcity, water conservation is one of the challenges in front of people. All the state universities are contributing in it by installing rain water harvesting system and installation of sewage treatment plant for treating and reusing water. Installation of sensor fitting in bathrooms of campus and hostels will also help the university for minimising unnecessary use of water. So, all the universities should replace their bathroom tabs with sensor tabs.

Conclusion:

On the basis of the analysis, it is found out that all the state universities are taking initiative towards making the green campus and trying to cutting their activities which harm the environment. All universities were trying to behave as a socially responsible institution by educating the society about conserving the environment and implementing green practices in the campus. On the basis of the analysis, various best practices initiated by universities have been identified which are common in all the state universities. The study also identified the area of improvement which make the universities more concerned for the environment and making them environment sustainable.

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
